The large funding pot for independent adjudicators brings the best adjudicators from all over the Europe together for a week. Additionally to that look forward to the socials that will combine truly classy venues like the Viennese city hall on the one hand and sunshine-loving barbeque socials with loads of booze on the other. Debating is about fun and we will pack a lot of it into Vienna EUDC 2015, so get stoked for our bid!

There will be venues worth dressing up for, e.g. when the mayor of Vienna invites you all for the championship dinner in Vienna's city hall. Yet, the Blue Danube Euros mean a lot more than that. The Danube, as the continent's second largest stream cuts through Europe's centre like a lifeline and connects more countries than any other river in Europe. The same is true for Vienna Euros: Vienna is in the heart of Europe and easily and cheaply accessible from all over Europe.

Furthermore, the brand new campus of the Vienna University of Economics and Business is right next to the Danube - and so are most other venues. It's summer and the Danube also provides the refreshing waters when they need to cool off after a hard day of debating. Vienna Euros will embrace the water-and-sunshine theme. Whether it's a barbeque at the Danube, or a massive pirate party at the end, you better not forget ya boardies mate!



DKWien

Debattierklub Wien is an enthusiastic crowd of Vienna students and the institution that stands behind this bid. DKWien was founded in 2004, first focusing on German language debates until the first BP debates took place in 2009. Since then, DKWien members became more and more active each year. While DKWien sent 30 teams to 24 tournaments in 2010/2011, the number surged to 58 teams at more than 30 international tournaments between June 2012 and June 2013, including a rapidly increasing number of breaking teams and adjudicators. Yet, not only do DKWien teams show up on nearly every tournament between Sydney and Dublin - DKWien members put even more effort into organising tournaments themselves. Since 2011, the Vienna IV, which annually takes place in early March, has grown from a regional 40 team tournament in its first edition to one of the most international tournaments of the planet. In 2013, teams from 25 nations competed at Vienna IV — indeed the tournament has become so popular that the cap of 68 teams was exceeded three times within a month of registration. We think the reason for this success is that we are very eager to make the maximum of the registration fee and make no concessions when it comes to the quality of adjudication, accommodation and socials. The same stands as promise for Vienna EUDC 2015.



To be sure, we could still organise a great EUDC if we secured the bid in 2014. Yet, bidding two years in advance gives us two advantages that will make Vienna EUDC just so much more awesome:

- 1- Many applications for governmental and EU funding need to be filed at least 1.5 years in advance. By getting the bid two years in advance we can meet these deadlines and access even more funding. In the end this means we will be able to fund more food, more free beer, better accommodation and a lot of other stuff that will make Vienna EUDC 2015 unique.
- 2- There are a lot of accommodation options within ten minutes from the campus where the rounds take place. Yet, there are only two very decent conference hotels right next to the campus, within five seconds walking distance, but they have booking cycles that require reservation two years in advance. If we get the bid two years in advance all debaters and adjudicators at Vienna EUDC will stay at one of these hotels. This means less travel time, more sleep and more time for enjoying yourselves at Vienna EUDC 2015!

Chief Adjudicator

Michael Shapira

DCA Appointment Process

Three DCAs will be appointed by application in 2014. The two year bid allows for a longer application process that makes it possible for us to gather detailed feedback on the applicants. Application for a DCA position on the Vienna EUDC 2015 Chief Adjudication Team will open in May 2014, with feedback following until early August. At EUDC 2014 we will announce the final team of DCAs, so that they are ready to join local tournaments with the start of the new season in winter 2014.

As a specific concern of the Org Com, we would like to invite young talents without a long history of "CA-ing" to apply as DCA, since we will take special care that they receive the same chances as those who are already well known and established.

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Convener

Stefan Zweiker seems to be everywhere. Literally. He turned up at more than 36 tournaments all over the globe, reaching from Sydney to Bristol. Also, wherever he set foot, he was quite successful. 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Chief of Staff & Volunteers



More to Come in 2014

A tournament director and officers for registration and socials will be appointed in March 2014, after the Vienna IV 14. The reason is that these jobs become more important in the year before Vienna EUDC. Also, we expect organisational talents to continue to develop and show off their skills at the upcoming Vienna IV, and we want to complete the Org Com with a fresh breeze of new people aboard in 2014.

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The Blue Danube Euros will take place at the brand new campus of the Vienna University of Economics and Business. The campus will be finished in 2013 and is the new home of Vienna's second largest University from September on. For Vienna EUDC, this means all debates will take place in brand new, air conditioned rooms within 5 minutes walking distance from the main lecture hall where the announcements are going to take place. The new campus has loads of space and a large lecture hall for the quarter- and semi-finals at the same place. Main and ESL Finals will take place in one of the halls of the Vienna Fair nearby which has more than enough space for all of you. Yet we do not want to exclude that we stumble across an even nicer venue for these rounds.

Accommodation

The hotels we plan to accommodate you in are the Austria Trend Hotel Messe and the brand-new Motel One Wien Prater which opens in 2014. Both of them are 3 star hotels placed right across the street from the campus (see map below).





At Vienna EUDC the tab is going to run as smoothly as water flows down the Danube. The tab-room will be right in the centre of the WU Campus and the place where we take action to reduce waiting time for the draw. Our tab team will find the right balance between flexibility and striking teams from the tab if they are late.

Florian Prischl


Tabmaster



Florian Prischl, our tab-master of Vienna IV 2012 and 13 is one of the founding members of DKWien. He has the experience of uncounted tournaments in his CV and the calm nature of someone who has been part of all the ups of downs of in the years when DKWien went from a society that had only a few members to a prospering crowd. This makes Florian an awe-some tab-master who is flexible on the one hand and has no fear of striking teams that do not show up on the other. With Florian aboard, 'important announcements' to bridge long waiting times are a thing of the past. At Vienna IV 2013 he was so fast that we ran 4 rounds on a day ahead of schedule - with the tab online 5 seconds after the winners were announced.

External Tabmasters

Florian will be supported by external tab-masters. We will appoint them within the upcoming month.



We want every single participant to feel welcomed and enjoy Vienna EUDC 2015. As a consequence, discriminatory or derogatory remarks and behaviour cannot be tolerated. To make sure that all persons' dignity is respected at the tournament our equity officers will draft an equity policy that safeguards the right balance between freedom of expression and another person's personal feelings. Together they will be there for all your problems, remarks and complaints at the Blue Danube Euros and mediate in case of conflict.

Moreover, we are aware that at some past competitions in the circuit, equity complaints were not only caused by participants but also by the Org Com. At Vienna EUDC, we therefore take a preventative approach: Our internal equity officer will make sure that equity is taken seriously by the Org Com. She will be deeply involved in the preparations and is therefore in a position to eliminate problematic incidents before they arise.

Drinks


